Hi Kelly,

The grain's been filed in ACE (arrival listed as 2/28) and the vessel's NOA has been filed with the Coast Guard (arrival listed as 2/27 23:00).

The corn is listed as cracked so if that's the case I just need to check the samples, one from each hold for the 4 BOLs listed.

There is one BOL for soybeans. In addition to the standard inspection they need to present an original Phytosanitary Certificate from Turkey (indicating the the soybeans were inspected and found free of Khapra Beetles, aka *Trogoderma granarium*). This should have been given to the captain at the time of loading. If no one has an original (like the last time they imported soybeans) then they should get on the phone with the Turks now and arrange an "overnight" shipment of one asap - this took a week last time!

Remember – no phyto no discharge!

Sunrise Foods International is listed as the Notify Party for all BOLs on the boat (including the stuff headed for New Orleans).
