We did look into this prior to our first discharge of Pearled Wheat in Stockton and as per Table 3-52 of the USDA Miscellaneous and Processed Products Manual, pearled wheat does not require a phytosanitary certificate. Please see snipit from manual as follows where the instruction is simply "Inspect and release":
