C Polis amendment to HR1599 to change the title of the bill to "The Deny Americans the Right to Know (DARK) Act." Failed to pass the House on July 23, 2015. Cornucopia supported this amendment. A Yes vote is worth 10 points.

D DeLauro amendment to prohibit the use of the term "natural" in products with genetically engineered ingredients. Failed to pass the House on July 23, 2015. Cornucopia supported this amendment. A Yes vote is worth 10 points.

E Huffman amendment to preserve the ability of tribes to restrict or prohibit cultivation of genetically engineered crops on tribal land. Failed to pass the House on July 23, 2015. Cornucopia supported this amendment. A Yes vote is worth 10 points.

F DeFazio amendment requiring companies that label products overseas as containing GMOs to use same label in the US. Failed to pass the House on July 23, 2015. Cornucopia supported this amendment. A Yes vote is worth 10 points.

G Genetically Engineered Food Right-to-Know Act (S511). Requires that genetically engineered food and foods that contain genetically engineered ingredients to be labeled accordingly. Introduced on February 12, 2015, but never voted on. Cornucopia supported this bill. Sponsorship of the bill is worth 5 points.

H Amendment to the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to Require Labeling of Genetically Engineered Fish (HR393). Prohibits the sale of food that contains genetically-engineered fish unless the food bears a label stating it has genetically engineered ingredients. Introduced on January 14, 2015, but never voted on. Cornucopia supported this bill. Sponsorship of the bill is worth 5 points.

Passed House on July 14, 2016 and was eventually signed into law. Cornucopia opposed this bill. A No vote is worth 25 points.
